Honoring First Responders Who Serve Us Daily

The Bellevue Exchange Club welcomes eligible blood donors to join them September 7 from 12 to 6 p.m. at the Ford Ice Center to show real appreciation for the first responders who serve the community daily.

"Our first responders put their lives on the line every day," said Exchange Club President Judd Cowan. "Bellevue is a better place because of their service."

Daily Need

Patients in local Nashville area hospitals rely on the generosity of fellow Nashvillians to supply the lifesaving blood products that they so desperately need. Blood cannot be manufactured and there is no substitute for blood. The American Red Cross sets up blood drives throughout all Middle TN to ensure that our hospital partners have an adequate supply of blood on hand.

Eligibility

Teenagers are invited to join in this life-giving community service. With a parent's consent 16year-old persons can donate and if the donor is healthy and well, there is no upper age limit. The Red Cross administers a detailed health history questionnaire and mini physical to ensure that it is safe for the donor to donate blood. <u>Questions can be researched here</u>.

Visitors to the blood drive will also be offered a camping cup and a cookbook while supplies last.

Commemoration

Several groups in the Bellevue Community are organizing a 20th Anniversary commemoration of the events of 9/11/01. At Red Caboose Park on the corner of Highway 70 and Colice Jeanne Drive, here will be patriotic music, a flag ceremony, a reading of the day's timeline by elected officials,



recognitions of top first responders, photo opportunities with an antique fire truck and the premier of *Their Stars Still Shine*, an original musical that honors the heroes of 9/11 as told by a parent to a child.

Local vendors have donated food for a "meat and three" lunch. Proceeds from the sales of the meals will create scholarships for children of first responders. Students in area schools will be participating in essay and art competitions whose winners will be announced at the event.

Additionally, there will be tours of the Bellevue Cabin, voter registration and a diaper drive through the Bellevue Food Bank.

The musicians will begin at 10 and the food will be available. The Remembrance Program begins at 11:30. Guests are invited to bring their own chairs or blankets for seating.
